In 2024, Session generally met monthly at 4:30 PM. Meetings begin in prayer, lighting of the Christ candle and a devotion led by Pastor Deb with group reflections. This is followed by reports from Pastor Deb (Pastoral Care, Worship plans, etc.), Clerk of Session and Committee chairs.

Buildings and Grounds Committee

Below is a summary of activity for the year of 2024 for Bethany's Buildings and Grounds Committee. Committee members are Craig Bray, Roxane Wales, and David Wales. Dave is Chair of the Committee.

The Committee manages our janitorial service, Centurion Services. To save money, we purchase janitorial supplies for the church rather than paying them a premium to do so; Dave handles supply coordination with the Centurion office.

Twice a year we ordinarily organize church-wide Work Days to spruce up the campus for Easter and Christmas. This is when many regular church members lend a hand in cleaning and maintaining the church. Please be aware that there are tasks for every skill level during our Work Day (indoors and out) and everyone is encouraged to participate!

Here are the activities the Committee is responsible for, or performed, in 2024 to maintain the church building and grounds.

- Roll out the garbage, recycling, and green cans every Tuesday. Many thanks to George Lynch and Tamra Hollenbeck for helping out with this when Dave is away.
- A landscape maintenance service has been retained. They are monthly keeping the landscaping on our campus looking professionally trimmed. Also, the two olive trees in front of the church were trimmed by an arborist.
- A large metal downspout rusted out, and former member Mitch Fontaine was gracious enough to fabricate a new downspout for Bethany. He did not ask for remuneration, however, we provided him with a gift card for Disneyland, as that is one of his family's favorite pastimes. Thanks to Craig Bray and Fred Matthews for installing it.
- Old metal shed that blew down the hill in 2023 was brought back up and hauled off to the dump in February.
- The Spring church-wide work day was conducted on March 25, 2024. The Fall workday was conducted November 16, 2024.
- Sturdy metal chains were installed across both driveways in June with reflective material added to make them visible at night. PG&E marked the spots where underground water and gas pipes were so we would not have

any problems installing the metal posts. We had issues with cars doing doughnuts in our parking lot and the neighbor across the street has expressed concern about various types of nefarious activity in our parking lot after hours. The unwelcome activity appears to have been curtailed as a result.

- New stove pilots. The stove does not have electronic starters. 5 of the pilot lights will be turned off, leaving only the ones closest to the island lit. The other pilots can be re-lit as needed.
- Old toilet seats in the women's bathroom were replaced in February. Also an easier to use paper towel dispenser was installed.
- The church is in the process of exploring the installation of a solar array for environmental and fiscal reasons. We would replace the old gas-powered boiler with a more economical and environmental heat pump system (that uses only electricity). Finding a company to provide this is proving to be difficult.
- Fred Matthew's neighbor, Osh Eliyahu, fixed various doors around Bethany that were out of alignment, or that were not properly closing and clicking shut. He did an excellent job.
- One of the urinals in the men's bathroom was leaking quite a bit of water when the handle was depressed. One of the members of the Sikh Gurdwara fixed it in September; we compensated him for his good work.
- The sump pump downstairs was not functioning properly, and overflowed slightly (and caused an excess of unpleasant odors). We have worked out with the Sikhs a process to monitor this before it happens again.
- The toilet seat in the men's bathroom cracked and was replaced in December. And a new Hook and Eye fastener (so the door could be locked for privacy) was installed to replace the old one that had failed.

The care of Bethany's building and grounds is a huge task, and thanks to the many hands of the members of this Committee and congregation for pitching in, the big task is manageable. **Many hands make light work!** AND we are always looking for new members so if you are interested in exercising your unique landscaping, carpentry, or just happy disposition skill-set to the greater glory of the Lord and Bethany please ask a committee member about joining us!

Financial Trustees

Bethany Presbyterian Church of San Bruno was fully supported by our congregation as we successfully completed 2024 in a positive position. This success is due to the faithful giving by our congregation which allows us to continue to be a part of and active in our vibrant community.

The Trustees spent time making sure our finances were in order, working with Session and Personnel to ensure all staff positions were filled, and the staff was working to the best of their ability. Each staff member received a moderate Christmas bonus.

We have a five-year renewable lease with our tenant, the Sikh Association, who occupies the downstairs of our building. There were various mechanical issues this year as the building continues to age, but overall, we worked through the issues that came before us.

Pledges, tenant income, and strong general giving make up the income received at Bethany Church.

The church continued to provide Presbytery USA support for mission giving in the amount of \$7,200, which is the same rate as in 2023.

Worship Committee

The following are some of the special worship services held this year.

Lent

The Lenten Season began with an Ash Wednesday service at Bethany, and continued with six Sundays of Lent. The church sanctuary was open on Good Friday to allow congregants an opportunity to retreat and reflect on the sacrifice of Jesus.

Easter

Easter was celebrated with two services, the Sunrise Service at the crack of dawn, followed by a reception with hot sticky rolls and other tasty treats. The traditional Worship Service was held at 10:00 am with lots of special music and a celebratory spirit.

Pentecost

The Spirit filled the sanctuary as we bid Pam and Fred Matthews goodbye. Pentecost is a time to reflect on who God sent to help guide us through life.

Liturgist Sign-up

We instituted a new way to welcome people to be liturgist during worship. There is a sign-up sheet in the Narthex for anyone interested and willing to be the liturgist during worship. Advent

Sundays, December 1, 8, 15, and 22. There was a hymn sing with Advent and Christmas carols on the first Sunday of Advent, December 1. Different groups of people lit the Advent Candle with a meditation on the Advent word for the day. The Advent words in order are: Hope, Peace, Joy, Love, and for Christmas Eve - Light.

The Ruth Covenant Group was started about 40 years ago at Bethany Presbyterian Church. At the time, there were two Presbyterian Women Circles at Bethany: The Hannah Circle, which met monthly during the day, and the Martha Circle, which met monthly in the evening. Both of those circles were attended primarily by women who were retired and/or had entered the time of life when their children were grown and moved away. The Ruth Group was formed by and for the younger women of the church who were working both in and out of the home. It was a wonderful support group for the women who weren't able to attend a daytime circle and for those of us who were starting careers in our various fields and/or raising children. The meetings consisted of a Bible study, often prepared by the Presbyterian Women USA, a check-in when our lives were shared with each other, prayer time, and delicious snacks!

As the years have gone by, both the Hannah and Martha Circles are no longer meeting, and the Ruth Group is comprised of women of all ages and walks of life. We continue to have a Bible or book study, check-in time, prayers, and snacks - still delicious! Participants are intergenerational, interfaith, and supportive women, all seeking to grow in our faith. The Ruth Group welcomes women of all ages, and we celebrate the richness that comes with new faces and ideas!
