point of the isolation of quiet retreat is not to remain in isolation. In the same paradoxical way, Lent is a chance to be honest about our inner *darkness and struggles* so that the *renewal and rebirth* that arrives with Easter can be celebrated with a new sense of clarity and yes, hope.

What the Heck is the Narthex?

This question has been raised a few times recently, and it seems like a very legitimate question! The Narthex is the open area between the pastor's and church administrator's offices. It contains the copy machines, a large round table with many important items (like sign-up sheets!!), and the entry doors to the sanctuary. So, whenever you hear, "It's in the Narthex," now you know what is being referred to!

<u>Bottom Layer</u>

1/2 cup butter 1/2 cup brown sugar, packed 1 cup flour (can use almond flour or any other gluten-free flour) Many people have requested the recipe for Dream Bars, which can be made gluten or gluten-free! My mom, Merriam Wycoff, made these for us, and this is the recipe she used. Enjoy! ~ Tamra

Mix butter and sugar thoroughly, then stir in flour until wellmixed. Press and flatten with hand to cover bottom of ungreased oblong pan 13x9x2 inches (or thereabouts!) Bake for 10 minutes.

Dream Bar Recipe

<u>Topping</u>

2 eggs, well-beaten
1 cup brown sugar, packed
1 tablespoon vanilla
2 tablespoons flour (can use gluten-free flour)
1 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. salt
1 cup coconut
1 cup chopped walnuts (or other favorite type of nut)

Preheat oven to 350°. Mix all ingredients of topping together, then spread over baked first layer. Return to oven and bake for 25 minutes more or until golden brown. Cool slightly, then cut into bars.

Ash Wednesday

There will be an Ash Wednesday Service on Wednesday, March 5, at 5:00 pm in the church sanctuary. It will be a simple service with scripture, Taize music, and the imposition of ashes. Please plan to come as we enter the season of Lent, a time of reflection and quiet.

Lent

The first Sunday in Lent will be Sunday, March 9. The liturgical art in the sanctuary will reflect this time of the Christian calendar, 40 days to consider the ministry of Jesus and its implications for our present day lives. The Sundays of Lent continue through Palm Sunday on April 13. Palm Sunday will include the waving of palm branches and shouts of "Hosanna!" as we commemorate the triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem.

Good Friday

Bethany will open the doors of the sanctuary from 12-3 pm on Friday, April 18. The congregation is invited to come by for a time of personal reflection and quiet, pondering the story of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ.

Easter

Easter will be celebrated on Sunday, April 20. The day will start at the crack of dawn with an Easter Sunrise Service at 6:15 am (sunrise will be at 6:27 am, so we want to make sure we are up in time to see it!!). Following the early morning outside service, everyone is invited into the warm sanctuary for coffee, hot cocoa, and a variety of sweet rolls and other treats.

The traditional Easter service will be at 10:00 am, and it will be celebrated with scripture, a wonderful message of resurrection, and glorious music! There will also be an Easter brunch to celebrate this jubilant day. We look forward to entering the Easter Season with all of you!
