Here on the left is the garden I wish I could grow. When I first moved to my current apartment I was so excited that I have this nice patio space. It's all concrete so no plants in the ground, but I put potted plants everywhere I could find. I love the colors of so many flowers! I went a little crazy at first and for a few years I purchased new flowers every season. But soon the plants would live their short lives and die and I kind of gave up on having a colorful patio.

Of all of the things that can go wrong with a plant, watering too much or not enough, too much sun or shade, trimming, dead

heading, etc. the biggest problem for me was that the flowers I was keeping in pots were really the kind of plants that wanted to be in the dirt in the ground.

The gospels tell us a parable of Jesus about a sower who went out to sow. Mark 4:4-8 says, "4 And as he sowed, some seed fell on a path, and the birds came and ate it up. ⁵ Other seed fell on rocky ground, where it did not have much soil, and it sprang up quickly, since it had no depth of soil. ⁶ And when the sun rose, it was scorched, and since it had no root it withered away. ⁷ Other seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it, and it yielded no grain. ⁸ Other seed fell into good soil and brought forth grain, growing up and increasing and yielding thirty and sixty and a hundredfold."

Sometimes when things seem wrong I work so hard to figure out what I can change to put things right. I think about facts, feelings, etc. But maybe sometimes, I'm just out of place. I'm not built to thrive in the soil I'm in. For all of us, that soil might be a relationship, a job, a city, a home, or a community. It's not easy to think about a change of place. And then, there's the other side. Have you ever had that wonderful feeling that you are exactly where you belong? You are planted in the right soil!

Worship Plans


